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
January is Mental Wellness Month

PSCH-PK Launches Community Education Programs for Professionals

January is designated as **Mental Weliness Month**. The new year is a time when many people set personal goals for the coming year. It is also a time when depression spikes in many individuals leading to thoughts of suicide. PSCH/Pederson-Krag (PK), through its Suicide Awareness and Training Programs for Professionals, confirms its commitment to enhance the public's awareness of suicide, its risk and protective factors and prevention strategies.

A Goal of Zero Suicide in NYS

The Office of Mental Health (OMH) Suicide Prevention Office (SPO) is seeking to make New York a model *Zero Suicide* state and a national model for integrating suicide prevention into behavioral health care. PSCH-PK is joining the New York State



ZERO Suicide Initiative by becoming one of the first behavioral health agencies, of its kind, to partner with OMH. The official kick off will be held on January 29th, 2016. *Zero Suicide* is both a philosophy and practical approach to suicide prevention. It begins with organizations committing to reducing the number of suicides through delivery of *suicide safer care*.

PSCH-PK is offering this free training to agencies, universities and other organizations and is designed for clinicians, counselors and other professionals interested in learning a comprehensive assessment model for suicide risk.

Seminars will be conducted by Max Banilivy, Ph.D., a noted clinical psychologist and Director of Training at the PSCH/PK Network.

We can change preconceived perceptions of mental illness by reducing the stigma surrounding mental health conditions, raising awareness, and connecting individuals with helpful resources that address their mental health concerns. Help us make 2016 a better year for mental health for all!

Over Adversity

Now I am a caring, giving mother who can support my beautiful child and feel good about who I am. I am blessed, thanks to PSCH.

Princella

Princella, 36 year old, knows the struggles that a woman who abuses alcohol from her teen years has to witness – loneliness, despair and the numb feeling of "who will take care for me?" Princella felt lost and abandoned in a spiraling slope of hopelessness. Princella engaged in a life of drinking and partying. At 26 years old, Princella became pregnant and was facing a life of single parenthood. Through a family friend, she was referred to PSCH's Family – Supported Housing Program in Queens.

Her life and her perspective shifted when she was introduced to PSCH Case Manager Eunice. Eunice became her inspiration to attend therapy and to provide a safe and healthy home for her daughter. Eventually, the veil of alcoholism lifted from Princella as her new found determination for clean living and motherhood became her focus.

Princella began to invest time to help her daughter develop properly. Princella enrolled her into a day school and other activities that would enhance her daughter's chance for success.

Princella began to volunteer at a local Catholic school as a receptionist and

teacher's assistant. Her voice is now being heard by the community in her new role as an advocate for the safety and well-being of young children.

Princella is an inspiration to others facing substance abuse issues and hopes that by sharing her story she can influence more of her friends to do the same. She has reclaimed her life and is taking control of her future and that of her nine year old daughter. With the help and support of her clinical team, the supervision of PSCH and the desire to become a better parent, Princella is on the road to recovery.
